You have been through two super typhoons, financial hardships, and a global pandemic. You've known the harsh reality of living without power and water, of worrying about the roof over your head and food for your loved ones, and, most recently, you've experienced the hardship of adjusting to a completely different way of learning and living.

My Despidida or my Adios to you is a final call to action, to go forth with the spirit of inafa' maolek, which means "to make good". This is my challenge to you: Go out and do good! Lift up the people around you. Solve problems and present solutions that make our CNMI community better. Go out on with the mission to make the Marianas and our world a better place.

graduates reach for their dreams amidst the pandemic

he year 2021 was an incredibly challenging year for students, teachers, and parents who had to set aside the normal course of in-person learning and switch to online learning. This was especially challenging to graduating students who went the extra mile to learn and earn their degrees despite the many obstacles and frustrations they faced. In spite of it all, they held on to their dreams and stayed focused and motivated.

Gov. Ralph Torres underscored how the pandemic made going and finishing school hard but big lessons were also learned. Saying he knows all the struggles they went through, Torres said the unique circumstances created a different character for each graduate that only made them stronger and tougher to face more challenges as they go on to the next phase in their lives.

It feels like a lot school experiences were taken away from students due to the pandemic-proms, field trips, group work, etc. To make it special for the graduates, teachers, principals and school heads got creative with how to hold graduation rites at their schools.



Private schools Mt. Carmel School, Saipan International School, and Agape Christian School held face-to face graduation ceremonies that conformed to the rules and regulations of the CNMI CO-VID-19 Task Force and mindful of maskwearing and social distancing protocols for both graduating students and their guests.

Mt. Carmel School had 40 senior graduates and 50 eighth-grade graduates. According to Dr. Galvin Deleon Guerrero, president Mount Carmel School, he was fortunate to work closely with the CO-



VID-19 Task Force last year to safely hold one of Saipan's only face-to-face graduation ceremonies, which they replicated this year while also ensuring everyone's safety and complying with COVID-19 mitigation guidelines. Sixteen students participated in the face-to-face graduation at Saipan International School that was held at the Royal Taga Hall of the Saipan World Resort, and Agape Christian School had a total of 38 graduates-20 seniors and 18 middle school-and their non-graduating students witnessed the graduation via Zoom.

Grace Christian Academy had 20 graduates and experienced a face-to-face graduation ceremony that was held at the GCA chapel. GCA principal Beth A. Nunez said the school is excited to celebrate the accomplishments of their students as they have been diligent in their studies and have learned to adjust in following health and safety protocols. She also commended GCA teachers for working hard and providing the best possible educational experience in a nurturing environment for each of the students.

EUCON International School has a total of 31 graduates this year (five from kindergarten, 11 from 6th grade, six from 8th grade and nine from 12th grade) that will experience face to face ceremony at the Adonai Auditorium inside the campus. According to school principal Wade Daniel Bacon, Ed., there will be various academic and character awards presented at each grade level and recognition of graduates from grades 6, 8, and 12. Three or four 12th grade students will deliver a graduation speech.

Marianas High School had over 300 graduates and the celebration was drivethru ceremony at the CPA Field in Dandan. School principal Jonathan Aguo,n M.Ed.,

said they chose this venue to accommodate the number of cars for all graduates to participate in this ceremony as having the graduation inside the MHS campus would result in a huge traffic that will affect the main traffic in Susupe.

Da'ok Academy celebrated its 29 graduates by holding a motorcade and diploma distribution. School principal Christine Loretta Tudela said that they have been regularly meeting with students and parents to give out the final details of the drive-thru graduation to achieve order and success.

Saipan Southern High School celebrated 150 graduates and will have a drive -thru graduation from Kilili Beach to SSHS grounds. As part of the preparations, they issued the cap and gowns early, made sure student names are spelled correctly in their diplomas, and finalized the speeches and list of guest speakers, said principal Vince de la Cruz.

Kagman High School had a total of 119 graduates. The graduation was a motorcade convoy that started at Mariana Resort & Spa and ended at the Kagman High School Loop.

Dr. Rita Hocog Inos Jr./Sr. High School had a motorcade around the baseball field in Songsong, Rota. Tables were placed at the covered part of the field where teachers handed out diplomas to students via drive-thru.

Tinian Jr./Sr. High School's graduation was different from last year as they held and inperson ceremony-the only public school that had an in-person graduation-instead of a motorcade like last year. They had 34 graduates and had the ceremony at the Jones Beach main pavilion. The in-person ceremony was by invitation only, adhered to COVID-19 safety protocols and was live streamed by the Tinian Mayor's Office.






